



Tom Haag of Eden Valley, Minnesota, serves as president of the Corn Board of the National Corn Growers Association, a farmer-led trade association with offices in St. Louis and Washington, D.C.

Haag is a fourth-generation family farmer in south-central Minnesota. Along with his son, Nathan, he grows more than 1,700 acres of corn and soybeans.

As NCGA President, he also serves as president of the National Corn Growers Association Foundation, as an executive committee member of NCGA's Allied Industry Council, and as the association's delegate to the U.S. Grains Council. He also serves as the liaison to the Agriculture Markets Advisory Council and the Renewable Fuels Association.

He previously chaired the Governance Committee, served on the Finance Committee and as board liaison to the Consumer Engagement Action Team, the Ethanol Action Team, the Market Development Action Team, the BNSF Railway Ag Business Council and the American Coalition for Ethanol.

A graduate of NCGA's Advanced Leadership program, he chaired NCGA's Grower Services Action Team. He served on the Research and Business Development Action Team prior to his election to the Corn Board.

Haag is a past president of the Minnesota Corn Growers Association and previously served as an appointee to the Minnesota Trade Advisory Council at the state level.
