

Kirk Satterfield Biography

Kirk Satterfield is a third-generation rice and soybean farmer from Bolivar County, Mississippi in the heart of the beautiful Mississippi Delta. Satterfield Farms is a family farming operation beginning in 1969 when his father, Travis, formed his own farming endeavor. In 2019 the farm celebrated 50 years of farming. Beginning in 1974, rice was grown on the farm and has been in continuous yearly cultivation since that time. The farm has implemented various water-saving and conservation techniques and continues to implement practices to be best stewards of the land.

Today Kirk and his wife Bridget continue to operate Satterfield Farms along with his mother and father, his brother and sister-in-law along with a niece and nephew and a great crew. Kirk has served on various boards and committees with USA Rice, including vice chair of the USA Rice Council, chair of the USA Rice Farmers Board of Directors, vice chair of the USA Rice PAC Board of Directors, and currently serving as the chairman of USA Rice.

On the state and local levels, Kirk currently serves as chair of the Mississippi Rice Council and is a past member of the Delta Council Board of Directors, where he still serves as the vice chair of the Rice and Small Grains Committee. He has also served in various capacities with Mississippi Farm Bureau, including county president and Chair of the Farm Bureau Rice Commodity Committee as well as serving on the Mississippi Farm Bureau F.A.R.M. Fund Board of Directors.
