Andrés Gil is director of the U.S. Chamber Center for Capital Markets Competitiveness (CCMC). CCMC was established in March 2007 to advocate legal and regulatory policies for the U.S. capital markets to advance the protection of investors, promote capital formation, and ensure U.S. leadership in the financial markets in the 21st century. At CCMC, Gil directs the international financial services portfolio, including standards set by European and foreign bodies, and also focuses on issues of market liquidity and bank and insurance capital.

Prior to joining the Chamber, Gil was an associate in a private law firm. His practice focused on domestic and international financial services policy, with an emphasis on banking, derivatives, and securities regulation pursuant to the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act.

Gil graduated with high honors from The George Washington University Law School and is a graduate of the University of Virginia. He is a member of the New York and District of Columbia state bars.
