Mr. Davis is Co-Chair of the Financial Markets and Regulation practice at Katten Muchin Rosenman LLP, where he assists clients with regulatory and litigation issues in the financial services sector, particularly derivatives products and crypto assets. Mr. Davis managed the CFTC's 65-person Office of General Counsel, handling all aspects of the agency's legal operations, including rulemakings, enforcement actions, appellate litigation and financial agency negotiations, among other areas. He also assisted with the development of LabCFTC, which served as the CFTC's hub for engagement with the fintech community to promote innovation and fair competition.

While at the CFTC, Mr. Davis received the Chairman's Award for Excellence in 2019. This award is the CFTC's highest honor, given to one employee annually in recognition of extraordinary accomplishments and superior service dedicated to realizing the vision, mission and values of the CFTC.

Previously, Mr. Davis served as counsel to the Assistant Attorney General, Civil Division for the U.S. Department of Justice. He also clerked for the Honorable Douglas H. Ginsburg at the United States Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit.
