INTERIM SUBALLOCATION OF BUDGET ALLOCATIONS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025

The Committee on Appropriations submits the following report on the interim suballocation of budget allocations for fiscal year 2025

The interim suballocations in this report assume a total discretionary budget allocation equal to the fiscal year 2025 limits on new budget authority established in the Fiscal Responsibility Act of 2023 (P.L. 118–5).

Discretionary outlays, mandatory budget authority and outlays, and adjustments to discretionary spending limits, consistent with the Fiscal Responsibility Act's amendments to section 251(b)(2) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, will be incorporated into revised allocations after scoring becomes available.

This report is submitted pursuant to the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 and related requirements under the Rules of the House.
