INTERIM SUBALLOCATION OF BUDGET ALLOCATIONS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2026

The Committee on Appropriations submits the following report on the interim suballocation of the budget for fiscal year 2026. This report is submitted pursuant to the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 and related requirements under the Rules of the House. Discretionary outlays, mandatory budget authority and outlays, and adjustments to discretionary spending limits will be incorporated into revised allocations after scoring becomes available.

The Committee has adopted this interim procedure because of the special circumstances it faces as it begins the fiscal year 2026 appropriations process. To date, Congress has not yet adopted a budget resolution for fiscal year 2026, and the Committee does not have an enforceable discretionary top line for fiscal year 2026. Additionally, the Fiscal Year 2026 Budget submission from the Office of Management and Budget was delayed.

By submitting this interim report and beginning its work on appropriations bills at this time, the Committee will be in the best possible position to report all fiscal year 2026 appropriations bills to the floor of the House of Representatives under regular order.
