AMENDMENTS TO THE BILL

On page 13 of the bill, line 9, strike “\$17,204,000” and insert “\$18,204,000” and amend the report accordingly.

On page 240 of the bill, line 14, strike “\$752,482,000” and insert “\$753,482,000”.

On page 200 of the bill, after line 25, insert the following subsection:

“(m) TAIWAN.—Of the funds appropriated by this Act and made available for assessed contributions to a specialized agency, body, or commission of the United Nations, 25 percent of such contribution shall be withheld from any such agency, body, or commission if the Secretary of State determines and reports to the Committees on Appropriations that after a formal request by Taiwan to participate as an observer in its meetings and activities, such agency, body, or commission failed to provide such status and that such withholding is in the na-

tional interest of the United States: *Provided*, That funds withheld pursuant to this subsection may be made available to support Taiwanese participation in professional development programs modeled on the United Nations Junior Professional Officer Program in organizations that provide Taiwan observer status: *Provided further*, That not later than 180 days after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit to the Committees on Appropriations a report identifying any agency, organization, or commission of the United Nations for which funds have been withheld pursuant to this subsection.”.

On page 230 of the bill, beginning on line 5, strike “Extension of Availability” and all that follows through the period on line 16 and make any necessary conforming changes to the bill and report.

On page 239 of the bill, between lines 6 and 7, insert the following new subsections:

“(h) None of the funds appropriated or otherwise made available by this Act may be made available in contravention of Executive Order 14172, relating to Restoring Names That Honor American Greatness, including to create, procure, or display any map that inaccurately depicts the Gulf of America.

“(i)(1) Notwithstanding section 7 of title 1, United States Code, section 1738C of title 28, United States Code, or any other provision of law, none of the funds provided by this Act shall be used in whole or in part to take any discriminatory action against a person, wholly or partially, on the basis that such person speaks, or acts, in accordance with a sincerely held religious belief, or moral conviction, that marriage is, or should be recognized as, a union of one man and one woman.

“(2) As used in paragraph (1), a discriminatory action means any action taken by the Federal Government to—

“(A) alter in any way the Federal tax treatment of, or cause any tax, penalty, or payment to be assessed against, or deny, delay, or revoke an exemption from taxation under section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 of, any person referred to in paragraph (1);

“(B) disallow a deduction for Federal tax purposes of any charitable contribution made to or by such person;

“(C) withhold, reduce the amount or funding for, exclude, terminate, or otherwise make unavailable or deny, any Federal grant, contract, sub-contract, cooperative agreement, guarantee, loan,

scholarship, license, certification, accreditation, employment, or other similar position or status from or to such person;

“(D) withhold, reduce, exclude, terminate, or otherwise make unavailable or deny, any entitlement or benefit under a Federal benefit program, including admission to, equal treatment in, or eligibility for a degree from an educational program, from or to such person; or

“(E) withhold, reduce, exclude, terminate, or otherwise make unavailable or deny access or an entitlement to Federal property, facilities, educational institutions, speech forum (including traditional, limited and nonpublic forum), or charitable fundraising campaigns from or to such person.

“(3) The Federal Government shall consider accredited, licensed, or certified for purposes of Federal law any person that would be accredited, licensed, or certified, respectively, for such purposes but for a determination against such person wholly or partially on the basis that the person speaks, or acts, in accordance with a sincerely held religious belief or moral conviction described in paragraph (1).”.

AMENDMENTS TO THE REPORT

On page 9 of the report, before the paragraph under the heading “Combating antisemitism”, insert the following paragraph:

*“Bureau of Medical Services.—*The Committee encourages the Department of State to allocate resources for the Bureau of Medical Services to support an integrated telemedicine platform to increase the capacity of the Bureau to deliver timely healthcare, create cost savings, increase efficiency, and improve the quality and accuracy of medical care. Adding an expanded capability that includes the integration of biomedical devices and remotely guided specialty care should further the Department’s goal of promoting and safeguarding the health and well-being of Chief of Mission personnel and their families and improve the continuity of care for the diplomatic community.”.

On page 26 of the report, under the heading “American Sections, International Commissions”, strike “\$4,000,000” and insert “\$5,000,000”.

On page 50 of the report, before the paragraph under the heading “Southern Cone”, insert the following paragraph:

*“PRC-linked scam centers.—*The Committee is concerned by the growth of PRC-linked scam centers across Southeast Asia and notes that Americans are estimated to have

lost \$5,000,000,000 to such scam centers in 2024 alone, an increase of 42 percent above the previous year. The Committee directs that funds under this heading be used to counter the threats posed by PRC-linked scam centers in Southeast Asia, which fuel corruption, violence, human trafficking, and massive economic fraud against the American public.”.

On page 65 of the report, after the first paragraph under the heading “Section 7024 (Prohibition on Censorship)”, insert the following paragraph:

“The Committee directs that funds appropriated or otherwise made available by this Act under Administration of Foreign Affairs be used to support the Secretary of State’s efforts to implement the visa restriction policy announced by the Secretary on May 28, 2025 pursuant to section 212(a)(3)(C) of the Immigration and Nationality Act, relating to Targeting of Foreign Nationals Who Censor Americans.”.

On page 66 of the report, beginning on the third line of the first full paragraph, strike “Honduras,” and insert in lieu thereof, “Djibouti, Honduras, Kuwait,”.

On page 74 of the report, under the heading “*Iran*”, at the end of the first paragraph, insert the following sentence:

“The Committee directs that \$2,000,000 above the prior year level be made available for the implementation, enforcement, and renewal of sanctions against Iran.”.

On page 78 of the report, before the paragraph under the “Syria” heading, insert the following paragraph:

*“Muslim Brotherhood.—*The Committee is deeply concerned by the destabilizing role that the Muslim Brotherhood plays in the Middle East and actions by Muslim Brotherhood entities in various countries that threaten United States interests in the region. Not later than 90 days after enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit a report to the appropriate congressional committees describing the policies, including visa restrictions, the Department of State is implementing to address the threats posed by the Muslim Brotherhood. For the purposes of this paragraph, the appropriate congressional committees shall also include the Committees on the Judiciary.”.

On page 103 of the report, before the paragraph under the heading “Greece”, insert the following paragraph:

*“Funding reports.—*The committee directs the Secretary of State to provide to Members of Congress, on request, such information as may be available to the Department

and appropriate to release regarding foreign assistance grants by non-United States donors to nongovernmental organizations funded by the United States in the European Union.”.

On page 103 of the report, before the paragraph under the heading “Nordic exchanges”, insert the following paragraphs:

*“Income tax treaties.—*The Committee encourages the Secretary of State, in coordination with other relevant Federal agencies as appropriate, to reexamine the potentially negative impacts that altering, suspending, or eliminating established income tax treaties has on NATO allies.”.

SEC. ____.(a) None of the funds appropriated or otherwise made available by this Act may be used to provide meals or per diem for any political appointee, including the Secretary of State, when such appointee is traveling to or visiting countries where—

(1) crisis-driven food insecurity has led to significant malnutrition among children; and

(2) United States food assistance has been withheld, reduced, or delayed as a result of the foreign aid freeze, the termination of USAID employees and distribution contracts, or other policy decisions attributable to the Department of State or the Administration.

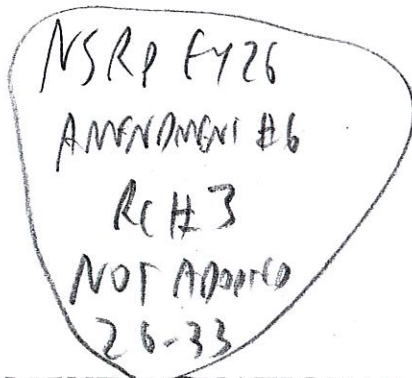

Page 207, strike section 7057 (limitations related to global health assistance) and insert the following:

**SUPPORT FOR WOMEN'S REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH,
FAMILY PLANNING ACTIVITIES, AND
UNITED NATIONS POPULATION FUND**

SEC. 7057. (a) ASSISTANCE.—Of the funds provided under title III of this Act for fiscal year 2025, not less than \$575,000,000 should be made available for family planning/reproductive health.

(b) CONTRIBUTION TO UNITED NATIONS POPULATION FUND.—(1) Of the funds made available in this Act for fiscal year 2026, a voluntary contribution may be made to the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) in order to provide assistance to expand access and use of contraception in developing countries, to furnish maternal and reproductive health care in humanitarian crises, to address the harmful practices of female genital mutilation and child, early and forced marriage, and to prevent obstetric fistula.

(2) Funds appropriated by this Act for UNFPA, that are not made available for UNFPA because of the operation of any provision of law, shall be transferred to the “Global Health Programs” account and shall be made available for family planning, maternal, and reproductive health activities, subject to the regular notification procedures of the Committees on Appropriations.

(3) None of the funds made available by this Act may be used by UNFPA for a country program in the People's Republic of China.

(4) Funds made available by this Act for UNFPA may not be made available unless—

(A) UNFPA maintains funds made available by this Act in an account separate from other accounts of UNFPA and does not commingle such funds with other sums; and

(B) UNFPA does not fund abortions.

(5)(A) Not later than 4 months after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of State shall submit a report to the Committees on Appropriations indicating the amount of funds that the UNFPA is budgeting for the year in which the report is submitted for a country program in the People's Republic of China.

(B) If a report under the preceding subparagraph (A) indicates that the UNFPA plans to spend funds for a country program in the People's Republic of China in the year covered by the report, then the amount of such funds the UNFPA plans to spend in the People's Republic of China shall be deducted from the funds made available to UNFPA after March 1 for obligation for the remainder of the fiscal year in which the report is submitted.

Such report shall include the impact on the U.S. economy in the short and long run, including whether such cancellation, reduction, or pause may result in job losses in the United States, loss of global market share and export opportunities for U.S. businesses or farmers, and overall economic growth.

Influence of the People's Republic of China.—The Committee is concerned that the termination of programs has provided opportunities for strategic competitors, like the People's Republic of China, to take advantage of the resulting gap in aid at a great cost to the U.S. national interest. Therefore, the Committee directs the Secretary of State to submit a report to the appropriate congressional committees not later than 180 days after enactment of this Act on the impact of changes since January 2025 to U.S. foreign aid policy on U.S.-China relations; China's involvement in global aid and development, particularly in sectors or geographical regions where the U.S. humanitarian and development presence has been significantly reduced or eliminated; China's expansion of power and influence through its Belt and Road Initiative and other investments; China's engagement to increase its control over critical minerals; and China's relations with countries in those regions.

**EFFICIENCY, COMPETITION, PERFORMANCE, AND CONTRACT MANAGEMENT
REQUIREMENTS.**

(a) Program and Regulatory Efficiency Reviews.

None of the funds appropriated or otherwise made available by this Act to the Department of State, the Millennium Challenge Corporation, the Peace Corps, or any other entity funded under this Act may be obligated or expended unless the Secretary of State—

- (1) Conducts annual program and operational performance reviews using outcome-based metrics consistent with the Government Performance and Results Modernization Act of 2010 (Public Law 111-352);
- (2) Completes a comprehensive review of agency rules, internal policies, and administrative requirements to identify outdated, duplicative, or inefficient provisions, and submits a Regulatory Modernization Report to the Committees on Appropriations within 18 months of enactment.
- (3) Identifies cost savings, administrative streamlining opportunities, and overlapping functions;
- (4) Adopts a framework to implement technological solutions for project oversight, milestone verification, and transparent reporting of disbursements; and
- (5) Submits a consolidated summary of findings and planned improvements to the Committees on Appropriations within 240 days of enactment.

(b) Contracting and Procurement Standards.

None of the funds made available by this Act may be used to enter into a new contract, grant, or cooperative agreement exceeding \$5,000,000 unless –

- (1) The award is made through full and open competition, except where urgent financial stability, national security, or public interest functions are certified in writing to the Committees on Appropriations;
- (2) The contract, grant, or cooperative agreement includes enforceable provisions requiring (i) project delivery on budget and on schedule; and (ii) the delineation of specific performance objectives and milestones with timelines for meeting such objectives and milestones;
- (3) The awarding agency adopts a framework to implement a technology-based or otherwise automated system to (i) verify and track awardee progress against agreement objectives, milestones, and timelines; (ii) make continuous disbursements contingent upon verified completion of agreement objectives, milestones, and timelines; and (iii) securely record and retain verification data and supporting documentation to ensure a transparent audit trail of each disbursement;
- (4) The agreement includes appropriate financial penalties, including liquidated damages, for unjustified cost overruns or schedule delays; and
- (5) For contracts or agreements exceeding \$10,000,000, the agency must submit a Contract Performance Summary to the Committees within 90 days of award.

(c) Quarterly Oversight Reporting

Each agency covered under this Act shall submit quarterly reports to the Committees on Appropriations that include:

- (1) Progress on annual performance reviews and implementation;
- (2) Regulatory modernization actions taken or planned;
- (3) Performance status of high-value contracts and grants, including details on performance objectives, the completion of milestones, and related timelines in

accordance with subsection (b)(2)(ii) and (b)(3), accompanied by verification records preserved by a technology-based or otherwise automated system;

(4) Identified cost savings and reinvestment proposals; and

(5) Status of updated performance metrics as required under section (d).

(d) Development and Submission of Updated Performance Metrics

None of the funds made available by this Act may be obligated or expended unless each agency covered under this section –

(1) Develops or updates performance metrics aligned with the findings of subsection (a)(1);

(2) Ensures all performance metrics are consistent with GPRMA standards and relevant to strategic goals (e.g., procurement timeliness, fraud prevention, IT modernization outcomes), and incorporates provisions for the secure recording and retention of verification data used to confirm the achievement of a contract, grant, or cooperative agreement, ensuring traceability and a transparent audit trail of each disbursement;

(3) Submits the updated performance metrics to the Committees on Appropriations within 180 days of enactment; and

(4) Provides a justification for each measure explaining its role in improving agency effectiveness, cost control, or public service.

SEC. 7070. (a) None of the funds made available by this Act may be used to pay for the destruction of perishable or nonperishable foreign assistance commodities and products subject to the provisions of this Act, including medicines, vaccines, medical devices, food, and food commodities that are procured, managed, controlled, or held in warehouses, ships, shipping containers, or any other storage facility, unless every effort has been made to sell, donate, or otherwise make the commodity available before the date the commodity spoils or expires, except in case of verifiable damage, defect, or expiration of commodities.

(b) Any commodities or supplies procured to carry out this Act or any Act making appropriations for prior fiscal years shall, without regard to provisions of law relating to the disposal of property owned by the United States Government, be transferred from any agency of the United States Government to a foreign government, public international organization, or nongovernmental organization when necessary to prevent spoilage or wastage of such commodities or to conserve the usefulness thereof.

- (b) INSPECTOR GENERAL REPORT.— Not later than 180 days after the date of enactment of this Act, the Inspector General of the Department of State shall submit to the appropriate congressional committees a report that includes—

 - c. an assessment of how such relationship, if any, may impact United States national security interests.

Where appropriate, insert the following paragraph.

Electronic Waste – The Committee is concerned about the unchecked export of electronic waste, or e-waste, such as old cell phones, computers, and servers to other nations. The flow to US e-waste to China and other foreign nations is on track to reach 80 million tons by 2030. Unfortunately, when e-waste is discarded overseas, it is frequently done in ways that are environmentally destructive or unlawfully turned into counterfeit electronics. These counterfeit electronics are often then resold to buyers in the United States where the faulty materials can make their way into critical US military equipment. The Committee directs the Secretary to coordinate with appropriate federal agencies on efforts to ensure that the recycling and export of United States e-waste does not undermine national security.

Hospital networks – The Committee encourages the Department of State to continue support to the East Jerusalem Hospital Network to support the provision of medicine, equipment, and administrative costs for the continuity of life-saving care. The Committee requires the Department of State to submit a report within 60 days after the date of enactment on support to the East Jerusalem Hospital Network.

ADDITIONAL LIMITATIONS ON OPERATIONS AND ASSISTANCE (SECTION 7068)

In the bill:

On page 236, strike “Section 7068,” and insert “None of the funds appropriated or otherwise made available by this Act or prior Acts making appropriations for the Department of State, foreign operations, and related programs may be obligated or expended to the entity known as the “Gaza Humanitarian Foundation,” or any other subsequent related organization until such time as the Secretary of State transmits to the Committees on Appropriations in a classified or unclassified format all information and evidence provided it by the Government of Israel related to the alleged diversion of UN humanitarian assistance to terrorist organizations in Gaza. Provided further, the transmission of this information shall include all related assessments of such information and evidence prepared by the Department of State and the Office of National Intelligence, including its subsidiary agencies. In addition, no funds may be transferred to the Foundation outside of the standard due diligence routinely performed by the Department of State for such categories of assistance without evidence presented to the Committee within 60 days of enactment of this Act including: 1) assessment and approvals by the Department of State of mandatory counterterrorism and anti-fraud safeguards; 2) risk assessments to evaluate potential risks associated with awarding funding; 3) reports detailing all deaths at or around distribution zones; and 4) detailed operational plans to minimize civilian deaths.”

**AMENDMENT TO NATIONAL SECURITY, DEPARTMENT OF

In the bill:

On page 226, between lines 10 and 11, insert the following new section:

Sec. ____ ENHANCED TRANSPARENCY REQUIREMENTS ON FUTURE
REDUCTIONS IN FORCE.

Thirty days prior to the implementation of any Reduction in Force, each department, agency, or organization funded in titles I, III, and VI of this Act shall submit to the appropriate congressional committees the following:

- (a) the justification for pursuing such action;
- (b) an accounting by office and function of personnel proposed to be affected;
- (c) the length of severance and availability of benefits to such individuals; and
- (d) an accounting of the source of funds and total cost of such action.

No funds made available by this Act or prior Acts may be made available to implement a Reduction in Force before such submission.
