Kate Nahapetian is the Government Affairs Director for the Armenian National Committee of America (ANCA), the largest grassroots, Armenian-American organization. Prior to joining the ANCA, Nahapetian worked as an attorney litigating complex class actions. In addition, she worked as a Policy Analyst with the Community Relations Service of the U.S. Department of Justice, which mediates ethnic and racial conflicts.

Nahapetian graduated *magna cum laude* with a degree in International Studies from American University and received a J.D. with a focus on international and human rights law from the University of California at Berkeley School of Law.

Nahapetian has worked on asylum and migration issues at the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, foreign policy issues in the U.S. Senate, and helped conduct human rights fact finding missions for Mental Disability Rights International.
