Talin Yacoubian is a founding partner of Yacoubian & Powell LLP, a boutique law firm she coestablished in 2010. With over three decades of legal experience, she has built a diverse practice representing clients in environmental law, complex litigation, real estate, and international business matters.

Talin began her legal career as a judicial extern to U.S. District Court Judge Dickran Tevrizian and later joined the nationally recognized Christensen firm, where she practiced in areas ranging from environmental and antitrust law to civil rights and intellectual property. She went on to focus more deeply on environmental litigation, representing one of California's largest solid waste companies and serving as trial counsel in a major toxic tort case. Notably, she played a central role in the Iron Mountain Mine Superfund settlement—one of the largest in U.S. history—on behalf of the State of California.

In 2002, Talin opened her own firm, Yacoubian Law Offices, where she represented clients in litigation and transactional matters and served as General Counsel to a multinational group in the renewable energy and conservation space.
