

Ann Thompson is the Executive Director of the Oklahoma Humanities Council. Her background is in the administration of nonprofit organizations, including the Southeastern Colorado Heritage Center in Pueblo, Colorado and the Museum at Southwestern Michigan College in Dowagiac, Michigan.

Ann was the Archivist for the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution in Washington, DC and the Curator of Education for the State Historical Society of North Dakota in Bismarck. She also was a high school teacher of U.S. History and French for ten years.

She has served on several boards including the Dogwood Fine Arts Festival in Michigan; the Charles Hall Youth Services of Bismarck, North Dakota; Historic Pueblo, Inc. of Pueblo, Colorado; Frontier Pathways, Scenic Byways of Southeastern Colorado.

She was a member of the Oklahoma Centennial Commemoration Commission, the advisory board of Oklahoma Literary Legends, and was Secretary of Preservation Oklahoma, Inc. She currently serves on the advisory board of the Petree College of Arts and Sciences at Oklahoma City University, Creative Oklahoma, and is a member of the Ralph Ellison Centennial Commemoration Committee.

She also represents Oklahoma on the Board of Directors of the Federation of State Humanities Councils where she serves as Secretary.
