

Mr. Miller is a partner with Sonosky, Chambers, Sachse, Miller & Munson, LLP. He has represented Tribes in the courts and in Congress for over 30 years and has recovered some \$200 million in tribal judgments against the government. In the self-governance arena, his litigation activities include the historic 2005 Supreme Court victory in Cherokee Nation v. Leavitt, a 2008 recovery of \$44 million against the Indian Health Service, the recent victory (with co-counsel Mike Gross) in the 2012 Salazar vs. Ramah Navajo Chapter Supreme Court class action against the Bureau of Indian Affairs, and the parallel 2012 Supreme Court victory against the Indian Health Service in Arctic Slope Native Assoc. v. Sebelius. Over the past 34 years Mr. Miller has also been very active in legislative and appropriations matters involving self-determination and self-governance issues, and has served on numerous agency rulemaking committees. Mr. Miller received his undergraduate degree from Yale University and his law degree with honors from the University of Virginia. He has been honored by the National Indian Health Board for his tribal advocacy, and in 2012 was honored by the Alaska Legislature and by the Healthy Alaska Natives Foundation for his lifetime work to advance Native American health and tribal self-determination.
