Waddell W. Stillman is President of Historic Hudson Valley, a nonprofit network of six National Historic Landmark sites along the Hudson River, and he serves in various leadership roles promoting natural and historic resources and heritage tourism in the Hudson River Valley. He was appointed by New York Governor George Pataki to help plan what has become the Beacon Institute for Rivers and Estuaries, and he serves on the management committee of the Hudson River Valley National Heritage Area. Waddell earned a B.A. in American Studies at Yale and an M.B.A. from Harvard. He is immediate past chairman and currently a trustee of the New York Genealogical and Biographical Society. He is a trustee of the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation, which makes grants to scholars in the humanities, arts and sciences, and he serves on the Foundation's nominating, investment, and audit committees. He is the treasurer of St. James' Church, a large Episcopal parish in New York City, where he married Yale classmate Kristina W. Stillman, the director of finance & administration and CFO of the Morgan Library & Museum. They live in New York City with their school-age children.
