He has received awards from United States Fish and Wildlife Service as Endangered Species Recovery Champion, AZA Plume Award – Clapper Rail Recovery Coalition and is a former California Condor Recovery Team member.

He participates in conservation field projects around the world involving endangered and threatened species such as the Andean condor in Colombia, White-bellied heron in Bhutan, Southern ground hornbill in South Africa, Red-necked ostrich in Niger, Guam rail, Light-footed Clapper rail in the United States and the California condor in the United States and Mexico.

He has authored numerous articles and papers on avian science in peer review journals and magazines.

Michael also serves as a spokesperson for San Diego Zoo Global.
