President Levi D. Carrick, Sr. is the elected President of the Bay Mills Indian Community. The Tribe is located in the beautiful Upper Peninsula of Michigan, occupying lands along the south shore of Lake Superior and the St. Mary's River. President Carrick was recently elected as the Chairman of the Great Lakes Resources Committee (GLRC) of the Chippewa Ottawa Resource Authority (CORA).

President Carrick was hired in 1976 as one of the first Police Officers for the Bay Mills Indian Community. In 1980 he left that position to pursue his career with the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) as a Game Law Enforcement Agent for the Michigan Agency. He enforced the federal and tribal commercial fishing laws on the Great Lakes for the federally recognized Tribes of the 1836 Treaty Ceded Waters. In 1986 President Carrick was promoted to the position of BIA Special Agent and held that position until 2011. During that time President Carrick directly worked with the CORA Tribes on behalf of the federal government in relation to the treaty fishing rights. In 2011 President Carrick was elected Chief Judge of the Bay Mills Indian Community Tribal Court. He held that position until 2013 when he was elected President (Chairman) of the Bay Mills Indian Community for a two-year term.

President Carrick has received numerous letters of commendation for his work as Special Agent from the U.S. Department of Justice, various U.S. Attorneys, and numerous tribal chairpersons for his exemplary case work and mediation of intra-tribal disputes.
