President Levi D. Carrick, Sr. was recently re-elected President of the Bay Mills Indian Community. Bay Mills is located in the beautiful Upper Peninsula of Michigan, occupying lands along the south shore of Eastern Lake Superior and the St. Mary's River. President Carrick is the Chairman of the Great Lakes Resources Committee (GLRC) of the Chippewa Ottawa Resource Authority (CORA) and is the current Chairman of the Inter Tribal Council of Michigan.

President Carrick held a lengthy career in law enforcement which began when he was hired as one of the first Tribal Police Officers for the Bay Mills Indian Community back in 1976. In 1980 he left Bay Mills to pursue his career with the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) as a Game Law Enforcement Agent for the Michigan Agency. His duties included the enforcement of federal and tribal commercial fishing laws on the Great Lakes over the federally recognized Tribes of the Treaty of 1836.

In 1986 President Carrick was promoted to the position of BIA Special Agent and held that position until mandatory age retirement in 2011. During that time President Carrick directly worked with the CORA Tribes on behalf of the federal government in relation to the treaty fishing rights. President Carrick has received numerous letters of commendation for his work as Special Agent from the U.S. Department of Justice, various U.S. Attorneys, and numerous tribal chairpersons for his exemplary case work and mediation of intra-tribal disputes.

Soon after retirement in 2011 President Carrick ran for and was elected Chief Judge of the Bay Mills Tribal Court. He held that position until 2013 when he was elected President (Chairman) of the Bay Mills Indian Community and he is currently in his second two year term.
