

Robyn Sunday-Allen (Cherokee) currently serves as the Chief Executive Officer for the Oklahoma City Indian Clinic. She attended the University of Oklahoma where she received her BA in Psychology, BSN in Nursing, and Master of Public Health in Health Administration and Policy. Robyn began her career at the OKC Indian Clinic as a Registered Nurse and became the Director of Nursing shortly thereafter. She was promoted to the Chief Operating Officer position in 2001 and was appointed as the President and CEO in 2009.

Robyn is currently on the Board of Directors for the National Council of Urban Indian Health (President-Elect), Oklahoma Quality Foundation, Leadership Oklahoma City, YMCA Greater OKC, and New View Oklahoma. She is a Graduate of Leadership Oklahoma City Class XXIX and Leadership Oklahoma Class XXVI. She is a member of Rotary Club 29.

Robyn has received many awards including Indian Health Service's Lifetime Achievement Award, Luana Reyes Leadership Award, AARP's Excellence in Leadership, *The Journal Record's* 50 Making a Difference Woman of the Year Honoree 2009, 2010 2012; *The Journal Record's* Oklahoma's Most Admired CEO Honoree 2009-2011 and was inducted as the first ever CEO in Oklahoma's Circle of Excellence.
