As a member of the 2015-2016 GEAR UP Alumni Leadership Academy, Jazmin participated in leadership training and provided 10 hours each month to community service in support of GEAR UP locally and nationally. In addition to her work with GEAR UP, she stays involved in Pretty Girls Sweat, an initiative encouraging young women to be active; she is involved with Black Girls CODE DC and has visited college campuses throughout the U.S. for "hackathons" encouraging young women to code and become involved in technology; and she was invited to participate in *The Chronicle of Higher Education's* journalism workshop.

Jazmin currently serves as The Huffington Post's Campus Editor-At-Large for Howard University, formerly served as senior campus editor and staff writer for the campus newspaper (The Hilltop), a web content writer for the college radio station website (WHBC963HD3.com), and an on-air intern at the university radio network (WHUR 96.3 FM).
