

DOUGLAS J. BESHAROV

Douglas J. Besharov is the Norman and Florence Brody Professor at the University of Maryland's School of Public Policy, where he teaches courses on poverty, welfare, children and families, policy analysis and logic models, program evaluation, and performance management (especially of work force development programs). He is also a senior fellow at the Atlantic Council, where he leads a program on international policy exchanges.

Among his eighteen books is *The Workforce Investment Act: Implementation Experiences and Evaluation Findings* (Kalamazoo, MI: Upjohn Institute for Employment Research, 2011), with Phoebe Cottingham. He has written more than 250 articles, and has contributed to *The Los Angeles Times*, *The New York Times*, *The Wall Street Journal*, and *The Washington Post*.

Between 1985 and 2009, he was also a resident scholar at the American Enterprise Institute for Public Policy Research in Washington, D.C. Between 1975 and 1979, he was the first director of the U.S. National Center on Child Abuse and Neglect. In 2008, he was President of the Association for Public Policy Analysis and Management (APPAM) and, subsequently, APPAM's International Conference Coordinator. He is now director of the University of Maryland's Welfare Reform Academy and its Center for International Policy Exchanges.

Together with Neil Gilbert of the University of California (Berkeley), Professor Besharov is co-Editor-in-Chief of the Oxford University Press Library on International Social Policy.
