Charles C Dike is Associate Professor of Psychiatry, and Associate Training Director, Law and Psychiatry Training Program, Yale University School of Medicine. He is also Medical Director, Office of the Commissioner, Connecticut Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services.

Dr. Dike completed medical school in Nigeria, and psychiatric training in England and Chicago, before completing a fellowship training in Law and Psychiatry at Yale University School of Medical.
