Tom Morris serves as the Associate Administrator for Rural Health Policy in the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS). In that role, Tom oversees the work of the Office of Rural Health Policy, which is charged with advising the Secretary on rural health issues. The Office administers a range of research and capacity building grant programs that serve rural communities. Tom has served on a number of cross-cutting rural efforts during his career, including the White House Rural Council from 2010 through 2018 as well as the current work of the HHS Rural Task Force and was one of the authors of the 2020 HHS Rural Action Plan.

In 2012, Tom was the recipient of the HHS Distinguished Service Award and in 2015 he was awarded a Presidential Rank Award for Meritorious Service. Over the course of his Federal career, Tom has testified on rural health issues before the House and Senate. He has past work experience in the U.S. Senate as well as various policy and program positions within HRSA and HHS.
