

EDWIN “ED” MEESE III



Ed Meese is currently associated with the Heritage Foundation as the leading think tank's Ronald Reagan Distinguished Fellow Emeritus. In that capacity, Meese oversees special projects and acts as an ambassador for Heritage within the conservative movement. He is also a distinguished visiting fellow at the Hoover Institution at Stanford University in California and lectures, writes and consults throughout the United States on a variety of subjects. From 1977 to 1981, Meese was a law professor at the University of San Diego, where he also directed the Center for Criminal Justice Policy and Management. From January 1981 to February 1985, Meese held the position of counselor to the President -- and functioned as Reagan's chief policy adviser. Meese then served as Attorney General under Ronald Reagan from 1985-1988. In May 2006, Meese was named a member of the Iraq Study Group and co-authored the group's final December 2006 report. Meese has authored several books, including *"Leadership, Ethics and Policing"*; *"Making America Safer"*; and *"With Reagan: The Inside Story"*.
