On July 24, 2017, Brandye Hendrickson was named Deputy Administrator of the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). In this capacity, she leads the daily operations of 2,900-person federal agency which spans six time zones. She oversees the agency's \$44 billion annual budget, directs execution of the "Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act" (FAST Act), and co-chairs the U.S.-Canada Transportation Border Working Group and U.S.-Mexico Joint Working Committee.

Hendrickson has a deep background in transportation, including two years serving as the Commissioner of the Indiana Department of Transportation where she oversaw all aspects of its operations – from its 3,400 employees to its \$400 million annual operating budget and billion-dollar annual construction budget. She has nearly 20 years of business experience.

She previously served as Deputy Commissioner of Indiana's Greenfield District (the Hoosier State's largest transportation district) from 2007-2015 where she managed an annual construction budget of approximately \$250 million and an annual operating budget of \$48 million. She has a Bachelor of Arts in Communications from Indiana University and is a Professional in Human Resources.
