



E. Wade Ballou, Jr. was appointed Legislative Counsel of the House of Representatives in July of 2016. He has been with the Office of the Legislative Counsel since 1983 and has worked in many areas of Federal law during his career, including natural resources, Native American issues, veterans, foreign affairs, and intelligence. Beginning in 1996, Wade concentrated in tax and public debt matters prior to being appointed Legislative Counsel.
