Ms. Christen Stevenson was appointed the Inspector General of the U.S. House of Representatives (House) on February 25, 2026. She joined the Office of Inspector General in March 2016 and has held multiple leadership roles, including Acting Inspector General, Deputy Inspector General, Director of Management Advisory Services, and an Assistant Director in the Performance and Financial Audits and Investigations Division.

Prior to her tenure at the House, Ms. Stevenson gained extensive experience in both the public and private sectors, working at organizations such as the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago, ABN AMRO Bank, Freddie Mac, the Government Publishing Office, Deloitte Consulting LLP, the U.S. Department of Treasury Office of Inspector General, and Cotton and Company LLP.

Ms. Stevenson is a Certified Public Accountant (CPA), Certified Information Systems Auditor (CISA), Certified Internal Auditor (CIA), Certified Fraud Examiner, Certified Government Financial Manager (CGFM), and Certified Financial Services Auditor (CFSA). She is a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants (AICPA), the Institute of Internal Auditors (IIA), the Association of Certified Fraud Examiners (ACFE), and the Association of Government Accountants (AGA).

Ms. Stevenson earned her Bachelor of Science in Accounting from Central Michigan University, a Master of Business Administration from the University of Maryland, and a Master of Engineering in Cybersecurity from The George Washington University.
