Moshe Schwartz is a Specialist in Defense Acquisitions at the Congressional Research Service and an adjunct professor at National Defense University's Eisenhower Center. He has written numerous reports and testified before Congress on a variety of issues, including the acquisition of major defense acquisition programs, the use contractors in military operations, DOD energy, and GAO bid protests. Temporary assignments include serving as a senior advisor to the Commission on Wartime Contracting in Iraq and Afghanistan, and as an advisor at ISAF headquarters in Afghanistan.

Before joining CRS, Mr. Schwartz served as a senior analyst at the Government Accountability Office, as an Assistant District Attorney in Brooklyn NY, and as Vice President of the Public Relations firm KCSA Strategic Communications.

Mr. Schwartz received a B.A. from Yeshiva University, a J.D. from Yeshiva University's Benjamin N. Cardozo School of Law, an M.B.A. from Carnegie Mellon's Tepper School of Business, and a Masters in Public Policy Management from Carnegie Mellon's H.
