# MAJOR GENERAL JEFFREY A. KRUSE

Maj. Gen. Jeffrey A. Kruse is the Director for Defense Intelligence Warfighter Support, Office of the Under Secretary of Defense for Intelligence, the Pentagon, Arlington, Virginia. Maj. Gen. Kruse leads three directorates ensuring combatant commands have the intelligence policy, processes and resources essential to plan and conduct successful operations and campaigns; plans, synchronizes and executes intelligence coalition and partner engagement activities for the Department; and oversees the Algorithmic Warfare Cross-Functional Team, Project Maven, the DoD's artificial intelligence pathfinder program.



Maj. Gen. Kruse previously served as the Director for Intelligence, U.S. Indo-Pacific Command. In this role he served as the Senior Intelligence Officer in the Asia-Pacific region responsible for the planning, coordination and execution of intelligence operations across the 36-nation theater.

Maj. Gen. Kruse was commissioned through the Reserve Officer Training Corps, Miami University, Oxford, Ohio. His career spans leadership and command positions at the tactical, operational and strategic levels in Air Force and joint assignments. He has commanded operational intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance units from squadron through wing level.

Maj. Gen. Kruse also performed legislative liaison duties to the U.S. Congress and served as a programmer, panel chair, and Chief of the Air Force "Engine Room" which develops the Air Force's \$120 billion annual budget. Maj. Gen. Kruse served as Senior Special Assistant to the Commander, U.S. European Command and Supreme Allied Commander–Europe; deployed to Southwest Asia as the Director of Intelligence for Combined Joint Task Force – Operation Inherent Resolve; and is now serving in his fifth joint assignment.
