David H. Ucko, Ph.D., is professor and department chair at the College of International Security Affairs (CISA) of the National Defense University, Washington DC. He oversees the delivery of CISA's Irregular Warfare area of concentration and the international deployment of its mobile education teams to conduct education and capacity building in irregular warfare.

Dr. Ucko has published extensively on counterinsurgency, war-to-peace transition, civil wars, and military intervention. Most recently, he authored *The Insurgent's Dilemma: A Struggle to Prevail* (Hurst / Oxford University Press, 2022) and, with Thomas A. Marks, *Crafting Strategy for Irregular Warfare: A Framework for Analysis and Action*, 2nd ed. (NDU Press, 2022).

Dr Ucko is an adjunct professor at Johns Hopkins University, a senior visiting fellow at the Department of War Studies, King's College London, and a 2023 Non-Resident Fellow with the Irregular Warfare Initiative. Dr. Ucko was previously program coordinator and research fellow for the Conflict, Security & Development Research Group at King's College London. He has also held research positions and visiting fellowships at various think-tanks, including the RAND Corporation in Washington DC, the Stiftung Wissenschaft und Politik (SWP) in Berlin, and the International Institute for Strategic Studies (IISS) in both in DC and in London.

Dr. Ucko obtained his Ph.D. at the Department of War Studies from King's College London
