Federal and Global Data Advocacy

- Engage with members of Congress on legislation such as the American Data Privacy and Protection Act, the Data Privacy Act of 2023, the Information Transparency & Personal Data Control Act, the NDO Fairness Act, Electronic Communications Act reform, and the Algorithmic Accountability Act.
- Successfully advocated for a Congressional Review Act resolution revoking the Federal Communication Commission's ("FCC") Broadband Privacy Rule.
- Testified before Congress and federal agencies on topics such as trustworthy AI, the need for federal privacy legislation, and against the Federal Trade Commission's ("FTC") Advanced Notice of Proposed Rulemaking on "Commercial Surveillance."
- Submitted comments to the FTC, FCC, National Telecommunications & Information Administration, National Institute for Standards & Technology, and White House Office of Science & Technology Policy on AI, targeted and digital advertising, information security, FTC Act Section 5 enforcement, and data privacy.
- Developed and organized the U.S. Chamber's Artificial Intelligence Commission on Competitiveness, Inclusion, and Innovation co-chaired by Representatives John Delaney (D-MD) and Mike Ferguson (R-NJ). The Commission held field hearings in the United Kingdom and the United States and worked with a diverse group of stakeholders to develop AI regulation recommendations.

State and Grassroots Data Advocacy

- Successfully advocated for passage of Virginia's Consumer Data Protection Act and the Texas Data Privacy and Security Act, and against proposed privacy in other states like North Dakota and Washington through direct lobbying, communications, and testimony.
- Submitted comments to the attorneys general of California and Colorado regarding regulations implementing state privacy laws.
