To study the delegation of examination authority under the Bank Secrecy Act in consultation with State bank supervisors, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. AML EXAMINATION AUTHORITY DELEGATION
4 STUDY.

5 (a) STUDY.—The Secretary of the Treasury shall 6 carry out a study, in consultation with State bank super-7 visors (as defined under section 3 of the Federal Deposit 8 Insurance Act (12 U.S.C. 1813)), and other relevant $\mathbf{2}$

stakeholders, on the Secretary's delegation of examination
 authority under the Bank Secrecy Act, including—

- 3 (1) an evaluation of the efficacy of the delega4 tion, especially with respect to the mission of the
 5 Bank Secrecy Act;
- 6 (2) whether the delegated agencies have appro7 priate resources to perform their delegated respon8 sibilities; and
- 9 (3) whether the examiners in delegated agencies
 10 have sufficient training and support to perform their
 11 responsibilities.
- 12 (b) REPORT.—Not later than 1 year after the date 13 of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of the Treasury 14 shall submit to the Committee on Financial Services of 15 the House of Representatives and the Committee on 16 Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs of the Senate a re-17 port containing—
- 18 (1) all findings and determinations made in car19 rying out the study required under subsection (a);
 20 and
- (2) recommendations to improve the efficacy of
 delegation authority, including the potential for dedelegation of any or all such authority where it may
 be appropriate.

(c) BANK SECRECY ACT DEFINED.—The term
 "Bank Secrecy Act" has the meaning given that term
 under section 5312 of title 31, United States Code.
