



Jacqueline Burns Koven is the Head of Cyber Threat Intelligence at Chainalysis, where she manages the team tracking nation state and criminal threat actors seeking to scam, steal, and extort cryptocurrency. Ms. Koven coordinates global cyber research, partnerships, and joint initiatives with task forces. She is a member of several working groups uniting stakeholders across industry and government to innovate new solutions, break down silos, and find effective new methods of countering malicious cyber activity and scams. She has testified before the Senate Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee and the House Financial Services Committee. Prior to joining Chainalysis, Ms. Koven served in the U.S. Intelligence Community, including in Iraq, and was selected for several interagency assignments. Select awards include the Office of the Director of National Intelligence National Intelligence Professional Award (NIPA), Joint Meritorious Unit Award, Secretary of Defense Medal for the Global War Against Terrorism, and the Joint Civilian Service Commendation Award. Ms. Koven holds a Masters in Public Administration from Columbia University specializing in Security Policy. At Columbia, Ms. Koven was a Research Fellow for Technology and Public Policy and earned the Dean's Public Policy Challenge Grant and the Association of Former Intelligence Officers (AFIO) Graduate Scholarship.
