SUBJECT: March 18, 2026, Subcommittee on National Security, Illicit Finance, and International Financial Institutions Hearing: “Oversight of the Export-Import Bank.”

On Wednesday, March 18, 2026, at 10:00 a.m., the Subcommittee on National Security, Illicit Finance, and International Financial Institutions of the Committee on Financial Services will hold a hearing in Room 2128 of the Rayburn House Office Building, titled “Oversight of the Export-Import Bank.” The following witness will testify:

- **The Honorable John Jovanovic**, President & Chairman, Export-Import Bank of the United States

The hearing will allow members to conduct oversight over the Export-Import Bank of the United States (EXIM), whose authorization expires in December 2026. Members will gain insight into how the Administration plans to use EXIM’s authorities and its legislative priorities for reauthorization. The hearing will enable Members to review EXIM’s charter and portfolio exposure, the effectiveness of its operations and programs, and its management practices. The hearing will also provide an opportunity to assess the global export credit landscape and EXIM.

Legislation Noticed:

1. **H.R. __, *Export-Import Bank Reauthorization Act of 2026***: This discussion draft reauthorizes the Export-Import Bank of the United States for five years through December 31, 2031, including reauthorization of the China and Transformational Exports Program (CTEP). It includes nuclear energy explicitly in CTEP, requires a strategy and timeline on efforts to ensure that China complies with Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) standards on export credit, and shifts authorities for OECD export credit negotiations from the President to the Secretary of the Treasury.
