

Amendment to the Chairman's Mark

Offered by Representative McGarvey

**No Taxpayer Funds for Ballrooms**

1. Decrease budget authority and outlays for Function 920 by the following amounts in millions of dollars to rescind money for an unauthorized ballroom.

- 2.. Make all necessary and conforming changes to the Chairman's mark.
3. Amend the committee report to reflect the following policy assumptions:

The resolution rejects spending \$396 million on a White House ballroom. The administration has directed that \$396 million of funds previously provided in P.L. 119-21 for United States Secret Service instead be used for the construction of the White House Ballroom. However, Congress did not provide those amounts for a ballroom and has not otherwise authorized the construction of a ballroom. As the courts consider if President Trump has overstepped his authority and bypassed congressional approval, this amendment clarifies that Congress has not provided approval or funding for a White House ballroom.
