

**Dr. Sherry L. Larkin** is a natural resource and environmental economist tenured in the Food and Resource Economics Department at the University of Florida. She earned her Ph.D. in agricultural and resource economics from Oregon State University in 1998 and has been a faculty member at UF/IFAS since 2000. In 2014 she moved into the Dean for Research Office within UF/IFAS. She served as the Associate Dean for Research and Associated Director of the Florida Agricultural Experiment Station (FAES) until March 2020. She currently serves as the director of the Florida Sea Grant College Program. In the profession Dr. Larkin has served as an elected member of the executive committee for the International Institute of Fisheries Economics and Trade (IIFET) and the president of the North American Association of Fisheries Economics (NAAFE). She was also an associate editor of the journal *Marine Resource Economics* from 2000-2015. As a result of her fisheries-focused research portfolio, Dr. Larkin has been actively involved in fisheries management by serving on the Scientific and Statistical Committees (SSCs) for both the South Atlantic and Gulf of Mexico Fishery Management Councils. In addition to seafood and fisheries, Dr. Larkin's research has studied the economic valuation of non-market benefits associated with alternative production techniques in farming and forestry, programs to improve water quality (including harmful algal blooms or HABs), and the impacts of the Deepwater Horizon oil spill. She currently serves as a Governor-appointed member of the HAB Task Force for the state of Florida (2019-present) and recently as a member of the Committee on the Use of LAPPs in Mixed-Use Fisheries managed by the National Academies of Science, Engineering and Math (2020 –2021).
