1 (c) Subgrants to Local Educational Agen-2 CIES.— 3 (1) IN GENERAL.—The State shall make subgrants to local educational agencies under subsection 4 5 (a)(1)(A) as follows: 6 (A) One-third of funds shall be awarded 7 not less than 15 calendar days after receiving 8 an award from the Secretary under this section. 9 (B) The remaining two-thirds of funds 10 shall be awarded only after the local educational 11 agency submits to the Governor and the Gov-12 ernor approves a comprehensive school reopen-13 ing plan based on criteria determined by the 14 Governor in consultation with the State edu-15 cational agency (including criteria for the Gov-16 ernor to carry out paragraph (2)), that de-
