## Markup Action Summary

**H.R. 6914, the *Pregnant Students' Rights Act***  
**H.R. 443, the *Enhancing Detection of Human Trafficking Act***

**January 10, 2024**

The Chair called up the following measures separately:

1. **H.R. 6914 (Rep. Hinson)** To require institutions of higher education to disseminate information on the rights of, and accommodations and resources for, pregnant students, and for other purposes.
  - i. Rep. Miller (R-IL) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 6914, designated [ANS\\_01](#).
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
  - a. Rep. Bonamici (D-OR) offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 6914, designated [AMD\\_01](#). The amendment failed by voice vote and a recorded vote was subsequently requested. AMD\_01 failed by a [roll call vote](#) of 15 yays and 23 nays.
  - b. Rep. Good (R-VA) offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 6914, designated [GOOD\\_125](#). The amendment passed by voice vote and a recorded vote was subsequently requested. GOOD\_125 passed by a [roll call vote](#) of 23 yays and 17 nays.
  - c. Rep. Manning (D-NC) offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 6914, designated [AMD\\_02](#). The amendment failed by voice vote and a recorded vote was subsequently requested. AMD\_02 failed by a [roll call vote](#) of 17 yays and 23 nays.
  - d. Rep. Jayapal (D-WA) offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 6914, designated [AMD\\_04](#). The amendment failed by voice vote and a recorded vote was subsequently requested. AMD\_04 failed by a [roll call vote](#) of 17 yays and 24 nays.

- e. Rep. Stevens (D-MI) offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 6914, designated [AMD\\_05](#). The amendment failed by voice vote and a recorded vote was subsequently requested. AMD\_04 failed by a [roll call vote](#) of 17 yays and 24 nays.
  - f. Rep. Hayes (D-CT) offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 6914, designated [COURTN\\_054](#). Rep. Hayes subsequently withdrew the amendment.
  - ii. A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 6914, as amended, was requested. H.R. 6914, as amended, was ordered favorably reported to the House by a [roll call vote](#) of 24 yays and 17 nays.
2. **[H.R. 443](#) (Rep. Walberg)** To direct the Secretary of Labor to train certain employees of Department of Labor how to effectively detect and assist law enforcement in preventing human trafficking during the course of their official duties, and for other purposes.
- i. Rep. Walberg (R-MI) offered an amendment in the nature of substitute to H.R. 443, designated [ANSHR443](#).
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
  - a. Rep. Adams (D-NC) offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 443, designated [HR443\\_PCA](#).
    - Rep. Walberg reserved a point of order on the amendment.
    - Rep. Walberg insisted on the point of order pursuant to Clause 7 of Rule XVI of the Rules of the House of Representatives.
    - Chairwoman Foxx ruled that HR443\_PCA is beyond the subject matter of H.R. 443 pursuant to Clause 7 of Rule XVI and sustained the point of order.
    - Ranking Member Scott motioned to appeal the ruling of the Chair.
    - Rep. Walberg motioned to table the appeal of the Chair's ruling.
    - The motion to table the appeal of the Chair's ruling passed by voice vote.
  - b. Rep. Omar (D-MN) offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 443, designated [HR443\\_WHD](#). The amendment passed by voice vote.
  - c. Rep. Norcross (D-NJ) offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 443, designated [HR443\\_LIC](#). Rep. Norcross subsequently withdrew the amendment.

- ii. A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 443, as amended, was requested. H.R. 443, as amended, was ordered favorably reported to the House by a [roll call vote](#) of 42 yays and 0 nays.
