

## Markup Action Summary June 13, 2024

## The Chair called up the following measures separately:

- 1. <u>H.R. 618</u> (**Rep. Walberg**) A bill to amend chapter 81 of title 5, United States Code, to cover, for purposes of workers' compensation under such chapter, services by physician assistants and nurse practitioners provided to injured Federal workers, and for other purposes.
  - i. Rep. Walberg (R-MI) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 618, designated <u>HR618\_ANS</u>.
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
  - A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 618 as amended was requested. H.R. 618 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a <u>roll call vote</u> of 36 yays and 0 nays.

- H.R. 8606 (Rep. Carter) A bill to reauthorize the Director of the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum to support Holocaust education programs, and for other purposes.
  - i. Rep. Wilson (R-SC) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 8606, designated <u>H8606 ANS</u>.
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
  - A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 8606 as amended was requested.
    H.R. 8606 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a <u>roll call</u> <u>vote</u> of 40 yays and 0 nays.
- 3. <u>H.R. 8648</u> (Rep. Chavez DeRemer) A bill to increase the transparency of colleges and universities in carrying out their civil rights responsibilities, and for other purposes.
  - i. Rep. Chavez DeRemer (R-OR) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 8648, designated <u>HR8648\_ANS</u>.
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
    - a. Ranking Member Scott (D-VA) offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 8648, designated <u>SCOTVA\_028</u>. The amendment failed by voice vote and a recorded vote was subsequently requested. The amendment failed by a <u>roll call vote</u> of 16 yays and 24 nays.
    - Rep. Manning (D-NC) offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 8648, designated <u>MANNIN\_059</u>. The amendment passed by voice vote.
    - c. Rep. Manning offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 8648, designated <u>MANNIN\_060</u>. Rep. Manning subsequently withdrew the amendment.
    - d. Rep. Manning offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 8648, designated <u>MANNIN\_061</u>. The amendment failed by voice vote and a recorded vote was subsequently requested. The amendment failed by a <u>roll call vote</u> of 16 yays and 23 nays.
  - A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 8648 as amended was requested.
    H.R. 8648 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a <u>roll call</u> <u>vote</u> of 25 yays and 15 nays.

- H.J. Res. 165 (Rep. Miller) Providing for congressional disapproval under chapter 8 of title 5, United States Code, of the rule submitted by the Department of Education relating to "Nondiscrimination on the Basis of Sex in Education Programs or Activities Receiving Federal Financial Assistance".
  - H.J. Res. 165 passed by voice vote. A recorded vote on the motion to report H.J. Res. 165 was requested. H.J. Res. 165 was ordered favorably reported to the House by a <u>roll call vote</u> of 24 yays and 16 nays.
- 5. <u>H.R. 6816</u> (Rep. Hern) A bill to prohibit the availability of Federal education funds for elementary and secondary schools that receive direct or indirect support from the Government of the People's Republic of China.
  - i. Rep. Moran (R-TX) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 6816, designated <u>H6816\_ANS</u>.
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
    - a. Ranking Member Scott offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 6816, designated <u>H6816\_AMD\_001</u>. The amendment failed by voice vote and a recorded vote was subsequently requested. The amendment failed by a <u>roll call vote</u> of 16 yays and 24 nays.
  - A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 6816 as amended was requested.
    H.R. 6816 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a <u>roll call</u> <u>vote</u> of 25 yays and 15 nays.
- 6. <u>H.R. 5567</u> (**Rep. Joyce**) A bill to prohibit elementary and secondary schools from accepting funds from or entering into contracts with the Government of the People's Republic of China and the Chinese Communist Party, and for other purposes.
  - i. Rep. Williams (R-NY) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 5567, designated <u>H5567\_ANS</u>.
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
    - a. Ranking Member Scott offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 5567, designated <u>H5567\_AMD\_001</u>. The amendment failed by voice vote and a recorded vote was subsequently requested. The amendment failed by a <u>roll call vote</u> of 16 yays and 24 nays.

- A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 5567 as amended was requested.
  H.R. 5567 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a <u>roll call</u> <u>vote</u> of 23 yays and 16 nays.
- 7. <u>H.R. 7227</u> (**Rep. Davids**) A bill to establish the Truth and Healing Commission on Indian Boarding School Policies in the United States, and for other purposes.
  - i. Rep. Kiley (R-CA) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 7227, designated <u>HR7227ANS\_01</u>.
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
  - A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 7227 as amended was requested.
    H.R. 7227 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a <u>roll call</u> <u>vote</u> of 34 yays and 4 nays.
- 8. <u>H.R. 8649</u> (Rep. Bean) A bill to ensure that parents are aware of foreign influence in their child's public school, and for other purposes.
  - i. Rep. Bean (R-FL) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 8649, designated <u>H8649\_ANS</u>.
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
    - a. Ranking Member Scott offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 8649, designated <u>AMD\_001</u>. The amendment failed by voice vote and a recorded vote was subsequently requested. The amendment failed by a <u>roll call vote</u> of 16 yays and 23 nays.
  - A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 8649 as amended was requested.
    H.R. 8649 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a <u>roll call</u> <u>vote</u> of 23 yays and 16 nays.
- 9. <u>H.R. 8534</u> (**Rep. Good**) A bill to prohibit a student athlete from being considered an employee of an institution, a conference, or an association based on participation in certain intercollegiate athletics.
  - i. Rep. Good (R-VA) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 8534, designated <u>HR8534\_ANS</u>.
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
  - A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 8534 as amended was requested.
    H.R. 8534 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a <u>roll call</u> <u>vote</u> of 23 yays and 16 nays.
