

## Markup Action Summary July 10, 2024

## The Chair called up the following measures separately:

- 1. H.R. 8932 (Rep. Houchin) A bill to establish an earlier application processing cycle for the FAFSA.
  - i. Rep. Houchin (R-IN) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 8932, designated ANS 001.
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
    - a. Rep. Good (R-VA) offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 8932, designated <u>GOOD\_156</u>. The amendment passed by voice vote.
  - ii. A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 8932 as amended was requested. H.R. 8932 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a <u>roll call vote</u> of 34 yays and 6 nays.
- 2. <u>H.R. 2574</u> (**Rep. Wild**) A bill to require the Director of the Office of Management and Budget to revise the Standard Occupational Classification System to accurately count the number of emergency medical services practitioners in the United States.
  - i. Rep. Thompson (R-PA) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 2574, designated HR2574 ANS.
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.

- a. Rep. Wild (D-PA) offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 2574, designated <u>WILDPA\_044</u>. The amendment passed by voice vote.
- ii. A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 2574 as amended was requested.
  H.R. 2574 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a <u>roll call</u> vote of 42 yays and 0 nays.
- 3. <u>H.R. 6319</u> (Rep. Torres) A bill to require the Director of the Office of Management and Budget to review and make certain revisions to the Standard Occupational Classification System, and for other purposes.
  - i. Rep. Chavez-DeRemer (R-OR) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 6319, designated <u>HR6319 ANS</u>.
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
    - a. Rep. Scott (D-VA) offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 6319, designated <a href="SCOTVA\_02">SCOTVA\_02</a>. The amendment passed by voice vote.
  - ii. A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 6319 as amended was requested. H.R. 6319 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a <u>roll call vote</u> of 42 yays and 0 nays.
- **4.** <u>H.R. 2941</u> (**Rep. Fitzpatrick**) A bill to require the Director of the Office of Management and Budget to revise the Standard Occupational Classification system to establish a separate code for direct support professionals, and for other purposes.
  - i. Rep. Smucker (R-PA) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 2941, designated <u>HR2941\_ANS</u>.
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
    - a. Rep. Scott (D-VA) offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 2941, designated <u>SCOTVA\_01</u>. The amendment passed by voice vote.
  - ii. A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 2941 as amended was requested. H.R. 2941 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a <u>roll call vote</u> of 42 yays and 0 nays.
- **5.** H.J. Res. 142 (Rep. Allen) A joint resolution providing for congressional disapproval under chapter 8 of title 5, United States Code, of the rule submitted by the Department of Labor relating to "Retirement Security Rule: Definition of an Investment Advice Fiduciary".

i. H.J. Res. 142 passed by voice vote. A recorded vote on the motion to report H.J. Res. 142 was requested. H.J. Res. 142 was ordered favorably reported to the House by a <u>roll call vote</u> of 23 yays and 18 nays.
