

## Markup Action Summary September 11, 2024

## Agenda:

- H.R. 5646, Stop Campus Hazing Act
- H.R. 7233, Jenna Quinn Law of 2024

## The Chair called up the following measures separately:

- 1. <u>H.R. 5646</u> (**Rep. McBath**) A bill to amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to require institutions of higher education to disclose hazing incidents, and for other purposes.
  - i. Rep. Thompson (R-PA) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 5646, designated HR5646ANS 01.
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
  - ii. A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 5646 as amended was requested. H.R. 5646 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a <u>roll call vote</u> of 28 yays and 2 nays.
- 2. <u>H.R. 7233</u> (**Rep. Moran**) A bill to amend the Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act to provide for grants in support of training and education to teachers and other school employees, students, and the community about how to prevent, recognize, respond to, and report child sexual abuse among primary and secondary school students.
  - i. Rep. Moran (R-TX) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 7233, designated ANS7233 01.
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
    - a. Rep. Scott (D-VA) offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 7233, designated SCOTVA 037. Rep. Miller (R-IL) raised a

point of order on the amendment not being germane to the underlying bill. Chairwoman Foxx ruled the amendment not germane, and the point of order was sustained.

- ii. A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 7233 as amended was requested. H.R. 7233 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a <u>roll call vote</u> of 33 yays and 0 nays.
- 3. <u>H.R. 736</u> (**Rep. Walberg**) A bill to require elementary and middle schools that receive Federal funds to obtain parental consent before changing a minor child's gender markers, pronouns, or preferred name on any school form or allowing a child to change the child's sex-based accommodations, including locker rooms or bathrooms.
  - i. Rep. Walberg offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 736, designated H736ANS 02.
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
  - ii. A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 736 as amended was requested. H.R. 736 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a <u>roll call vote</u> of 22 yays and 12 nays.
- 4. <u>H.J. Res. 181</u> (**Rep. Walberg**) Providing for congressional disapproval under chapter 8 of title 5, United States Code, of the rule submitted by the Department of Labor relating to "Definition of 'Employer' -Association Health Plans".
  - i. H.J. Res. 181 passed by voice vote. A recorded vote on the motion to report H.J. Res. 181 was ordered favorably reported to the House by a <u>roll call vote</u> of 23 yays and 12 nays.
- 5. <u>H.R. 3120</u> (Rep. Steel) A bill to ban anticompetitive terms in facility and insurance contracts that limit access to higher quality, lower cost care.
  - i. Rep. Steel offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 3120, designated <u>H3120-EW-AINS 01</u>.
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
  - ii. H.R. 3120 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a voice vote.
- 6. <u>H.R. 9457</u> (**Rep. Bean**) A bill to amend the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 to prohibit increased payments under a group health plan or group health insurance coverage for telehealth services furnished by a provider located at a facility.
  - i. Rep. Bean offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 9457, designated, TELE-FACILITY-AINS 01.
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.

- a. Rep. Hayes (D-CT) offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 9457, designated <u>H9457-MIN-AMD-01</u>. The amendment passed by voice vote.
- ii. A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 9457 as amended was requested. H.R. 9457 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a <u>roll call vote</u> of 34 yays and 0 nays.
