



## Markup Action Summary February 12, 2025

### The Chair called up the following measures separately:

1. [H.R. 1048](#) (Rep. Baumgartner) A bill to amend the *Higher Education Act of 1965* to strengthen disclosure requirements relating to foreign gifts and contracts and to prohibit contracts between institutions of higher education and certain foreign entities.
  - i. Rep. Baumgartner (R-WA) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 1048, designated [DETERANS\\_01](#).
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
  - a. Ranking Member Scott (D-VA) offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 1048, designated [DEM\\_AMD\\_04](#). The amendment failed by voice vote and a recorded vote was subsequently requested. The amendment failed by a [recorded vote](#) of 14 yeas and 20 nays.
  - b. Rep. Adams (D-NC) offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 1048, designated [DEM\\_AMD\\_03](#). The amendment failed by voice vote and a recorded vote was subsequently requested. The amendment failed by a [recorded vote](#) of 14 yeas and 20 nays.
  - c. Rep. Lee (D-PA) offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 1048, designated [DEM\\_AMD\\_02](#). The amendment failed by a voice vote and a recorded vote was subsequently requested. The amendment failed by a [recorded vote](#) of 14 yeas and 20 nays.

- d. Ranking Member Scott offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 1048, designated [DEM\\_AMD\\_01](#), and subsequently withdrew the amendment.
  - ii. A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 1048 as amended was requested. H.R. 1048 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a [recorded vote](#) of 20 yeas and 14 nays.
- 2. **[H.R. 649](#) (Rep. Thompson)** A bill to amend the *Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act* to allow schools that participate in the school lunch program under such Act to serve whole milk.
  - i. Rep. Thompson (R-PA) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 649, designated [THOMPA\\_010](#).
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
  - ii. A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 649 as amended was requested. H.R. 649 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a [recorded vote](#) of 24 yeas and 10 nays.
- 3. **[H.R. 1069](#) (Rep. Hern)** A bill to prohibit the availability of Federal education funds for elementary and secondary schools that receive direct or indirect support from the Government of the People's Republic of China.
  - i. Rep. Kiley (R-CA) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 1069, designated [ANS\\_001](#).
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
  - a. Ranking Member Scott offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 1069, designated [DAMD\\_001](#). The amendment failed by a voice vote and a recorded vote was subsequently requested. The amendment failed by a [recorded vote](#) of 14 yeas and 20 nays.
    - b. Rep. Bonamici (D-OR) offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 1069, designated [DAMD\\_002](#). The amendment failed by a voice vote and a recorded vote was subsequently requested. The amendment failed by a [recorded vote](#) of 14 yeas and 20 nays.
  - ii. A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 1069 as amended was requested. H.R. 1069 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a [recorded vote](#) of 21 yeas and 13 nays.

4. **H.R. 1005** (Rep. David Joyce) A bill to prohibit elementary and secondary schools from accepting funds from or entering into contracts with the Government of the People's Republic of China and the Chinese Communist Party, and for other purposes.
- i. Rep. Rulli (R-OH) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 1005, designated ANS 001.
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
  - a. Ranking Member Scott offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 1005, designated DAMD 001. The amendment failed by a voice vote and a recorded vote was subsequently requested. The amendment failed by a recorded vote of 14 yeas and 20 nays.
  - b. Rep. Bonamici offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 1005, designated DAMD 002. The amendment failed by a voice vote.
- ii. A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 1005 as amended was requested. H.R. 1005 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a recorded vote of 20 yeas and 14 nays.
5. **H.R. 1049** (Rep. Bean) A bill to ensure that parents are aware of foreign influence in their child's public school, and for other purposes.
- i. Rep. Mackenzie (R-PA) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 1049, designated ANS 001.
    - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
  - a. Ranking Member Scott offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 1049, designated DAMD 001. The amendment failed by a voice vote and a recorded vote was subsequently requested. The amendment failed by a recorded vote of 14 yeas and 20 nays.
  - b. Rep. Bonamici offered an amendment to the amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 1049, designated DAMD 002. The amendment failed by a voice vote and a recorded vote was subsequently requested. The amendment failed by a recorded vote of 13 yeas and 20 nays.
