

Markup Action Summary April 9, 2025

Agenda:

- H.R. 2617, Say No to Indoctrination Act
- H.R. 2616, PROTECT Kids Act
- H.Res.237, Of inquiry requesting the President and directing the Secretary of Education to transmit, respectively, certain documents to the House of Representatives relating to the reduction in force and other downsizing measures at the Department of Education

The Chair called up the following measures separately:

- 1. <u>H.R. 2617</u> (Rep. Owens) A bill to amend the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 to prevent the use of funds under such Act to teach or advance concepts related to gender ideology, and for other purposes.
 - i. Rep. Owens (R-UT) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 2617, designated <a href="https://owens.com/owens/continued-com/ow
 - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
 - ii. A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 2617 as amended was requested. H.R. 2617 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a <u>recorded vote</u> of 18 yeas and 12 nays.

- 2. <u>H.R. 2616</u> (Chairman Walberg) A bill to require public elementary and middle schools that receive funds under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 to obtain parental consent before changing a minor's gender markers, pronouns, or preferred name on any school form or sex-based accommodations, including locker rooms or bathrooms.
 - i. Chairman Walberg (R-MI) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 2616, designated PROTECTANS 001.
 - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
 - ii. A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 2616 as amended was requested. H.R. 2616 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a <u>recorded vote</u> of 18 yeas and 12 nays.
- 3. <u>H.Res.237</u>, (Ranking Member Scott) Resolution of Inquiry requesting the President and directing the Secretary of Education to transmit, respectively, certain documents to the House of Representatives relating to the reduction in force and other downsizing measures at the Department of Education.
 - i. Rep. Onder (R-MO) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.Res.237, designated HRES237ANS 01.
 - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
 - ii. A recorded vote on the motion to report H.Res.237 as amended was requested. H.Res.237 was ordered adversely reported to the House as amended, by a <u>recorded</u> vote of 18 yeas and 12 nays.
- 4. <u>H.R. 2262</u> (Rep. Hinson) A bill to amend the *Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938* to exclude certain activities from hours worked, and for other purposes.
 - i. Rep. Miller (R-IL) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 2262, designated ANS2262 01.
 - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
 - ii. A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 2262 as amended was requested. H.R. 2262 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a <u>recorded vote</u> of 18 yeas and 13 nays.

- 5. H.R. 2270, (Rep. Messmer) A bill to amend the *Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938* to exclude child and dependent care services and payments from the rate used to compute overtime compensation.
 - i. Rep. Messmer (R-IN) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 2270, designated ANS2270 01.
 - The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
 - ii. A recorded vote on the motion to report H.R. 2270 as amended was requested. H.R. 2270 was ordered favorably reported to the House as amended, by a recorded vote of 18 yeas and 13 nays.
