



## Mairin Mancino

Mairin Mancino is the Senior Advisor for Policy at the Peterson Center on Healthcare, a non-profit organization dedicated to making higher quality, more affordable health care a reality for Americans. She is a health policy expert committed to improving our healthcare system by seeding change through regulatory and legislative action. Prior to Peterson, Mairin held leadership roles in healthcare research and consulting at NORC at the University of Chicago and Avalere Health. While at NORC and Avalere, she led teams of staff working to deliver compelling research, policy collateral and strategic advice to health plans, provider organizations, pharmacy benefit managers, health IT companies, pharmaceutical manufacturers, philanthropies, health care trade associations and healthcare investors. Her work has spanned timely topic areas such as understanding health disparities in employer-sponsored coverage, studying the care navigation experiences of high-need commercially insured patient populations, interpreting the potential paths of federal and state price transparency efforts, and helping companies prepare for commercial insurance market changes stemming from the Affordable Care Act. Mairin was also the System Director for Policy and Advocacy at Summa Health, an integrated health care delivery system in Akron, Ohio with inpatient, outpatient, ambulatory and post-acute care settings, along with a health plan, an employed physician group and an Accountable Care Organization (ACO). Her portfolio at Summa covered local, state and federal regulatory and legislative policy. Prior to specializing in healthcare, she worked to interpret federal legislative and regulatory happenings for the investment community at FBR Capital Markets (now B. Riley) and at Washington Analysis. Mairin graduated magna cum laude from Amherst College.
