

Short Bio – Jessica Levin, Education Law Center

Jessica Levin is the Litigation Director at Education Law Center (ELC), a non-profit organization that pursues justice and equity for public school students by enforcing their right to a high-quality education in safe, equitable, non-discriminatory, integrated, and well-funded learning environments. She is also the Director of Public Funds Public Schools (PFPS), a national campaign led by ELC to ensure that public funds for education are used to support and strengthen public schools. Ms. Levin's work at ELC has included impact litigation, direct representation, and policy advocacy on an array of issues including private school vouchers, school funding, special education, the rights of English learners, and equity in assessment policy.

Prior to joining ELC as a Skadden Fellow in 2014, Ms. Levin served as a law clerk to the Honorable Carlos F. Lucero of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Tenth Circuit. She received a B.A., magna cum laude, from Cornell University, an M.Phil. in Comparative Government from the University of Oxford, and a J.D., cum laude, from Harvard Law School.
