

Amy K. Matsui is Vice President for Child Care and Income Security at the National Women's Law Center. She leads the Center's work on state and federal child care and early learning policies, and policies that affect the economic security of women and families. Her work comprises policy analysis, administrative and legislative advocacy, and public education and outreach. She has written extensively about the intersection of gender and care, tax, and retirement security; testified before Congress and federal agencies; and been featured as an expert in the media.

Prior to joining the Center in 2002, Ms. Matsui was a litigation associate at Farella Braun + Martel LLP, in San Francisco, CA. She clerked for the Honorable Carolyn Dineen King, then-Chief Judge of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit, in 2000.
