

Michaele N. Turnage Young serves as Senior Counsel and Co-Manager of the [Equal Protection Initiative](#) at the Legal Defense Fund (“LDF”), where she litigates education cases.

Ms. Turnage Young served as co-lead counsel in [NAACP v. U.S. Department of Education](#), wherein the Court [enjoined](#) the U.S. Department of Education from requiring every state education agency to certify compliance with its misinterpretation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

Ms. Turnage Young also represents (or represented) amici curiae and intervenors in the lawsuits concerning the admissions processes for the Thomas Jefferson High School for Science and Technology in Northern Virginia; the magnet middle schools of Montgomery County, Maryland; and the specialized high schools of New York City.

Ms. Turnage Young represented 25 Harvard student and alumni organizations as amici curiae in *SFFA v. Harvard*.

Prior to joining LDF in 2017, Ms. Turnage Young served as a Trial Attorney with the Educational Opportunities Section of the Civil Rights Division of the United States Department of Justice.

Ms. Turnage Young clerked for the Honorable Joan B. Gottschall of the United States District Court for the Northern District of Illinois. She received her law degree from Harvard Law School, where she served as a student attorney with the Harvard Legal Aid Bureau and as an editor of the Harvard Civil Rights-Civil Liberties Law Review. Ms. Turnage Young earned her undergraduate degree from UCLA.
