

AMENDMENT TO H.R. 4278
OFFERED BY MR. CONNOLLY OF VIRGINIA

At the end of title I, add the following:

1 **SEC. 110. ANNUAL REPORT ON SECURITY DEVELOPMENTS**
2 **IN THE RUSSIAN FEDERATION AND THEIR EF-**
3 **FECTS ON UKRAINIAN SOVEREIGNTY.**

4 (a) REPORT.—Not later than September 30, 2014,
5 and September 30 of each year thereafter through 2020,
6 the Secretary of State shall submit to the specified con-
7 gressional committees a report, in both classified and un-
8 classified form, on the current and future security and for-
9 eign policy posture of the Russian Federation (in this sec-
10 tion referred to as “Russia”).

11 (b) MATTERS TO BE INCLUDED.—The report re-
12 quired under subsection (a) shall include the following:

13 (1) An assessment of the security situation in
14 regions neighboring Russia, including Crimea.

15 (2) The goals and factors shaping the security
16 strategy of the Government of Russia, including po-
17 tential annexation of non-Russian territory.

18 (3) Trends in Russian security behavior that
19 would be designed to achieve, or that are consistent
20 with, the goals described in paragraph (2).

1 (4) An assessment of the global and regional se-
2 curity objectives of the Government of Russia, in-
3 cluding objectives that would affect the North Atlan-
4 tic Treaty Organization, the Middle East, or the
5 People’s Republic of China.

6 (5) A detailed assessment of the sizes, loca-
7 tions, and capabilities of the nuclear, special oper-
8 ations, land, sea, and air forces of the Government
9 of Russia and how they affect neighboring countries,
10 including Ukraine.

11 (6) Developments in Russian military doctrine
12 and training and whether the developments have dif-
13 fered from before the annexation of Crimea.

14 (7) Other security developments involving Rus-
15 sia that the Secretary of State considers relevant to
16 United States national security.

17 (c) SPECIFIED CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES DE-
18 FINED.—In this section, the term “specified congressional
19 committees” means—

20 (1) the Committee on Foreign Affairs and the
21 Committee on Armed Services of the House of Rep-
22 resentatives; and

23 (2) the Committee on Foreign Relations and
24 the Committee on Armed Services of the Senate.
