The parent organizations of the James Martin Center received contracts from the Defense Threat Reduction Agency for work to be executed by the Center each year from 2008 to 2010 and in amounts ranging from \$1.2 to \$1.6 million. A small portion of these funds were expended for an analysis that I led of nuclear power developments in the Middle East. The National Nuclear Security Administration provided two contracts to the James Martin Center's parent from 2012 to 2014, ranging from \$162,000 to \$175,000, to study options for spent fuel management in the ROK and opportunities for U.S.-ROK cooperation on other nuclear issues, respectively. The parent organization also received a contract from Sandia National Laboratories in 2014 for the James Martin Center to conduct a workshop of Middle East specialists to discuss enhancing safety and security of nuclear power facilities in the region. I did not receive support under these contracts. As noted, I am not representing the James Martin Center or its parent but am appearing in my private capacity as an expert on the issues that are the subject of this hearing.
