

## **Natan B. Sachs**

Dr. Nathan (Natan) Sachs is a Foreign Policy Fellow at the Brookings Institution's Center for Middle East Policy in Washington D.C. His work focuses on Israeli foreign policy, domestic politics, the Arab-Israeli conflict and U.S.-Israeli relations. He is currently writing a book on Israeli grand strategy and its domestic origins. He has taught on the Arab-Israeli conflict at Georgetown University's Government Department and research design at the Security Studies Program at Georgetown. Sachs has written for *Foreign Affairs*, *The Washington Post*, *The New York Times Global* and *Foreign Policy*, among other publications, and has provided commentary for numerous media outlets, including *NBC Nightly News*, *Israel Channel 2*, *MSNBC*, *BBC* and *NPR*. Before joining Brookings, Sachs was a Hewlett fellow at Stanford's Center on Democracy, Development and the Rule of Law and a Fulbright Fellow in Indonesia, where he researched the effects of Islamic and nationalist identity on inter-ethnic relations. Sachs earned a bachelor's degree in the Amirim Excellence Program at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, and an M.A. and a Ph.D. in political science from Stanford University.
