FAROUQ HABIB is a Program Manager at Mayday Rescue, a non-profit organization which provides support to Syria Civil Defense. A leading civilian revolutionary activist from Homs, Syria, Farouq is also the founding director of the Emissa organization, a Syrian civil society NGO working in Homs.

He was instrumental in the formation of the Homs Revolutionary Council and the Homs Quarters Union, as well as the Homs Provincial Council and the Union of Syrian Economists.

He has represented his people in negotiations with UNSMIS and the Kofi Annan missions and was one of four activists invited by then-Secretary of State Clinton to the UN General Assembly in 2012. He proposed humanitarian confidence-building measures to the UN and Arab League Special Envoy to Syria, Lakhdar Brahimi, that fed into Geneva II negotiations. He was detained by the Regime for 3 months in 2012. A banker by training and profession, he holds a bachelor's degree in economics, a diploma in international commerce, a master's degree in banking and finance and a doctorate in business administration.
