

**AMENDMENT TO THE AMENDMENT IN THE  
NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE TO H.R. 2061  
OFFERED BY MR. YOHO OF FLORIDA**

Redesignate sections 5 through 7 as sections 6  
through 8, respectively.

Insert after section 4 the following:

1 **SEC. 5. ACTIONS TO PROMOTE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION**  
2 **AND DEMOCRACY IN NORTH KOREA.**

3 The North Korean Human Rights Act of 2004, as  
4 amended by this Act, is further amended—

5 (1) in subsection (a) of section 103 (22 U.S.C.  
6 7813)—

7 (A) by striking “radio broadcasting” and  
8 inserting “broadcasting, including news re-  
9 broadcasting,”; and

10 (B) by striking “increase broadcasts” and  
11 inserting “increase such broadcasts, including  
12 news rebroadcasts,”; and

13 (2) in subsection (a) of section 104 (22 U.S.C.  
14 7814)—

15 (A) by striking “The President” and in-  
16 serting the following:

1 “(1) IN GENERAL.—The President”;

2 (B) by inserting “, USB drives, micro SD  
3 cards, audio players, video players, cell phones,  
4 wi-fi, wireless internet, webpages, internet, wire-  
5 less telecommunications, and other electronic  
6 media that share information” before the period  
7 at the end; and

8 (C) by adding at the end the following new  
9 paragraphs:

10 “(2) DISTRIBUTION.—In accordance with the  
11 sense of Congress described in section 103, the  
12 President, acting through the Secretary of State, is  
13 authorized to distribute or provide grants to dis-  
14 tribute information receiving devices, electronically  
15 readable devices, and other informational sources  
16 into North Korea, including devices and informa-  
17 tional sources specified in paragraph (1). To carry  
18 out this paragraph, the President is authorized to  
19 issue directions to facilitate the free-flow of informa-  
20 tion into North Korea.

21 “(3) RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT GRANT  
22 PROGRAM.—In accordance with the authorization de-  
23 scribed in paragraphs (1) and (2) to increase the  
24 availability and distribution of sources of informa-  
25 tion inside North Korea, the President, acting

1 through the Secretary of State, is authorized to es-  
2 tablish a grant program to make grants to eligible  
3 entities to develop or distribute (or both) new prod-  
4 ucts or methods to allow North Koreans easier ac-  
5 cess to outside information. Such program may in-  
6 volve public-private partnerships.

7 “(4) CULTURE.—In accordance with the sense  
8 of Congress described in section 103, the Broad-  
9 casting Board of Governors may broadcast Amer-  
10 ican, Korean, and other popular music, television,  
11 movies, and popular cultural references as part of its  
12 programming.

13 “(5) RIGHTS AND LAWS.—In accordance with  
14 the sense of Congress described in section 103, the  
15 Broadcasting Board of Governors shall broadcast to  
16 North Korea in the Korean language information on  
17 rights, laws, and freedoms afforded through the  
18 North Korean Constitution, the Universal Declara-  
19 tion of Human Rights, the United Nations Commis-  
20 sion of Inquiry on Human Rights in the Democratic  
21 People’s Republic of Korea, and any other applicable  
22 treaties or international agreements to which North  
23 Korea is bound.

24 “(6) BROADCASTING REPORT.—Not later  
25 than—

1           “(A) 180 days after the date of the enact-  
2           ment of this paragraph, the Secretary of State,  
3           in consultation with the Broadcasting Board of  
4           Governors, shall submit to the appropriate con-  
5           gressional committees a report that sets forth a  
6           detailed plan for improving broadcasting con-  
7           tent for the purpose of reaching additional au-  
8           diences and increasing consumption of uncen-  
9           sored news and information using all available  
10          and reasonable means; and

11          “(B) one year after the date of the enact-  
12          ment of this paragraph and annually thereafter  
13          for each of the next five years, the Secretary of  
14          State, in consultation with the Broadcasting  
15          Board of Governors, shall submit to the appro-  
16          priate congressional committees a report on the  
17          effectiveness of actions taken pursuant to this  
18          section, including data reflecting audience and  
19          listenership, device distribution and usage, tech-  
20          nological development and advancement usage,  
21          and other information as requested by such  
22          committees.”.
