John S. Miller is Vice President for Global Policy and Law, Cybersecurity and Privacy, at the Information Technology Industry Council (ITI), the global voice of the tech sector. Mr. Miller currently leads ITI's global policy work and advocacy on cybersecurity, privacy and data protection, electronic surveillance, government access and encryption, and digital policy issues related to emerging technologies.

Prior to ITI, Mr. Miller worked for nearly a decade in the Global Public Policy organization at Intel Corporation. In his most recent position at Intel, Mr. Miller served as the company's Director of Cybersecurity Policy and Government Relations and Managing Counsel, leading Intel's cybersecurity policy strategy and influencing activities in the U.S. and spearheading Intel's global policy strategy development and advocacy efforts on issues including cybersecurity threat information sharing, electronic surveillance and communications privacy, and issues at the intersection of human rights and technology.

A proven IT industry leader on security and privacy policy, Mr. Miller currently serves as Vice Chair of the Information Technology Sector Coordinating Council. Mr. Miller also currently serves as a member of the Future of Privacy Forum Advisory Board.

Prior to joining Intel, Mr. Miller was an attorney in private law practice, representing corporate clients in a variety of complex business and intellectual property litigations and regulatory matters.

Mr. Miller received his J.D. from the University of Wisconsin Law School, where he served as Articles Editor of the Wisconsin Law Review, and his B.A., *summa cum laude*, from Hamilton College.
